Along with this, Garg will also present handloom essentials like lehengas, kurtas and saris for to-be brides to take inspiration from.

GIVE your home a makeover this Monsoon with artisan carpets designed by rural weavers in Rajasthan. The 'Artisan Originals' collection has been curated by Jaipur Rugs and each piece has been designed and hand-woven by local craftspeople with over two decades experience. Take for instance the rug named 'Khushboo' that has been conceptualised by Santa Devi and Laxmi from Udaipur village — the women took inspiration from the rectangular boxes that make up the khadiya (coot) in their courtyard. Similarly, the 'Dochira' rug has been designed by Sujana ji who wanted to celebrate elements from his family home and local ceremonies. Accordingly, the rug includes diamond shaped motifs drawn from a baharpara, a popular village snack, and flowers that take inspiration from hahar, a pot weaver use for her design. The 4x6 feet rug is priced at ₹7,500, while the 12x18 feet ones are at ₹25,200. Decor enthusiasts can visit the Moharli-based store for more details.


## 'Wahabism replacing Sufism a cause for concern in Valley'



